## EXECUTIVE REPORT - Kellye O'Brien

Room parent lists were finalized and have connected with teachers. Some parent get-togethers
are already being planned. The room parents will also help with teacher gifting for Christmas
and birthdays.

## TREASURER'S REPORT – Bryan Belton

- PTO generated a net income of nearly \$2,300 in September. The highlight was a robust Recycled Uniform sale of \$1450. Since these uniforms are donated, all revenue from these sales flows right to the bottom line. A huge thank you to Jennifer Zammit who has done such a great job organizing this effort.
- Spirit Wear also booked nearly \$1,000 in sales during the month of September. Typically, the proceeds from sales are netted against the cost of inventory, but a lot of the sales so far this year are from selling off inventory from last year that has already been paid for. Thank you to Marie Carroll and Sarah Williams for running such a great operation.
- We have already exceeded our budgeted goals for both Recycled Uniforms and Spirit Wear so we are off to a great start.
- Some additional money for class dues of \$400 trickled in.
- For Athletics, the PTO is subsidizing the expense for an additional coach for the golf program. The Wednesday practice is split between on the course and the practice range. An additional coach was needed to provide on course supervision/instruction. The additional cost was \$575.

- Trunk or Treat chairs had asked for a budget to purchase some supplies and prizes for the games at the event. \$750 was added to the Trunk or Treat Budget.
- A formal vote of the budget for 2021/2022 will occur at the November meeting. Please reach out with any request for any last-minute adjustments.

    - 5-6B Team: Friday night 5-6pm Saint Demetrios Church
    - 5-6G Team: Friday night 6-7pm Saint Demetrios Church
  - On February 6, 2022 there will be a Jamboree for all 5 teams.

# Faith Enrichment

## SJS School Liturgies

- Liturgies are calendared for each month this year and are expected to be hosted by different grades as in the past. Families are permitted to attend this year.
- Grades K-6 attend in person, also livestreamed to classrooms and for any families or remote students.
- SJS choir performed at October liturgy and plan to continue in future months.

### SJS-Hosted Sunday Masses

- First SJS-hosted Mass was October 3. Many SJS students attended in uniform and students filled roles as greeters, altar servers and readers. Have been asked to bring up gifts and pass collection baskets at the remaining Masses as well (initially had planned to have any children from the Collaborative for gifts and baskets to keep them involved, but feeling is there are adequate opportunities other weeks and it is a nice way to highlight the school.)

## Community Service

- Ms. MacDonald is leading Community Service this year. They are keeping it in-house but will
  need families to help with deliveries, etc., like last year, and appreciate our help
  communicating initiatives to families via Room Parents.
- Grades are not "owning" projects this year, but Grade 5 and 6 students will be Community Service liaisons, going to each classroom to give info about organizations and why we are supporting them. Flyers created in-house will include ideas to have students more invested, like article and video re: Hurricane Ida and QR codes to video and C2C website.
- First project was dress down day fundraiser for Hurricane Ida relief raised \$1200.
- This week collecting winter coats and other winter clothes for Cradles 2 Crayons. Schedule for the year was sent in last Friday's Principal Update and is on social media.

#### **HOSPITALITY COMMITTEE – Katie Smith**

- Hospitality had the first *Morning Mingle* on Friday, October 1, which was an opportunity to chat with other parents. *Morning Mingles* will be the First Friday of every month and held outside for as long as possible.
